

Responding to Your IRS Notice

Do not ignore any notice from the IRS. If you do not pay your full tax debt or make a different payment plan to pay the full amount, the IRS can take action against you. The IRS may file a Notice of Federal Tax Lien, and may take your money and property to pay your debt.

If you cannot make any payment at this time, call the IRS at 1-800-829-1040.

If the IRS decides you cannot pay any of your tax debt, the IRS may delay collection until you can pay. The IRS will ask you for information from pay stubs, rental agreements or mortgage statements, and car lease/loan statements.

You have rights and protections during the collection process.
